

LOCKING DEVICE - INSTALLATION

When storing your GForce Arms EXODUS® firearm or when you don't plan to use it immediately, it is crucial to utilize the locking device.

Ensure that the muzzle is always pointed in a safe direction and keep your fingers outside the trigger guard while installing the locking device.

FOLLOW THESE STEPS TO INSTALL THE LOCKING DEVICE PROVIDED BY THE FACTORY:

1. Take out the t from your pistol.

2. Fully open the slide and confirm that the firearm is completely unloaded, with no cartridges or cartridge cases present. Utilize the slide stop to keep the slide open while installing the locking device.

3. Insert the cable directly into your pistol.

4. To lock: Turn the key to its farthest clockwise position and insert the loose end of the cable into the lock. Rotate the key counterclockwise and remove it.

5. Once the lock is securely closed, pull firmly on it to test the connection and ensure that it is locked. Remember not to leave or store your firearm with the key in the lock! Store your locked and unloaded firearm, along with the key, in separate secure locations, away from ammunition, children, and unauthorized adults.

WARNING - USE OF LOCKING DEVICES



Do not store keys in lock.

- 1. Always keep your firearm pointed in a safe direction, including when you are installing or removing your locked device.
- Prior to installing the locking device, always confirm that your firearm is completely unloaded.
- Unless explicitly instructed otherwise, avoid installing locking devices in the trigger guard. Instead, keep your fingers and locking device outside the trigger guard during installation and removal.
- Store your firearms, ammunition, and keys separately and securely, away from children and individuals who may handle them carelessly. Avoid storing your firearm with the keys inside the locking device.
- 5. Do not attempt to operate the firearm's slide while the locking device is in place, as this can cause damage.
- 6. While locking devices contribute to security measures, they should never be relied upon as a substitute for responsible firearm handling and proper storage. Keep in mind that any mechanical device can be bypassed given enough time, knowledge, determination, and equipment.

FIREARM SAFETY

IMPORTANT WARNING: IT IS IMPORTANT FOR YOU TO RECEIVE PROPER TRAINING FROM A COMPETENT FIREARMS INSTRUCTOR OR AUTHORITY BEFORE BEGINNING TO SHOOT OR WHEN HANDLING THE FIREARM.

COMPLETELY READ AND UNDERSTAND YOUR OWNER'S MANUAL GUIDELINES BEFORE USING YOUR FIREARM.

You should fully understand the function of all of the components and mechanics of the firearm. Before you remove the firearm out of the box thoroughly read the owner's manual on how to properly carry, handle, load, unload, and store your new firearm. Know the rules of proper gun safety and exercise them at all times because failure to do so may result in death or injury to vourself or others. Because it is impossible to list every firearm situation or scenario, be aware that certain circumstances may require additional safety rules unique to a particular situation. In these cases, we recommend that you obtain specific training by a certified instructor for unique situations

ALWAYS LEARN THE SPECIFIC MECHANICAL AND HANDLING CHARACTERISTICS OF YOUR HANDGUN

All firearms are different thus it is important for you to understand how to properly carry, use, and handle each one according to its specific guidelines. Before using any firearm, one must completely familiarize themselves with the type of firearm and its specific safe handling procedures for loading, unloading and carrying.

NEVER GIVE THE HANDGUN TO ANY PERSON WHO HAS NOT THOROUGHLY FAMILIARIZED HIMSELF OR HERSELF WITH ALL OF THE INFORMATION,

SAFETY RULES, AND WARNINGS IN THE OWNER'S MANUAL NEVER ALTER OR MODIFY YOUR FIREARM

This firearm was produced under specific manufacturer guidelines and should not be modified under ANY circumstances. Altering the trigger, mechanical components, safety mechanisms, or using any parts or accessories other than those that were provided in the original box with your gun or specifically recommended in this manual is NOT RECOMMENDED by the manufacturer, and could result death, bodily harm, or compromise your safety or the safety of others. Any alteration made to the firearm also voids the factory warranty.

ALWAYS KEEP THE FIREARM UNLOADED UNTIL READY TO USE

Firearms should be kept unloaded when not in use. Whenever you pick up a firearm, immediately engage the safety device and remove the magazine to visually inspect the chamber and confirm that it is clear. Always unload all ammunition from the chamber and remove the magazine after:

- 1.) Shooting
- 2.) Putting the firearm away
- 3.) Putting the firearm into a case
- 4.) When not in use
- 5.) When handing it to another person

ALWAYS KEEP THE MUZZLE POINTED IN A SAFE DIRECTION

It's as simple as that, and it's up to you. Never point your gun at anything you do not intend to shoot. The safe direction may be "up" on some occasions or "down" on others, but never pointed at anyone or anything not intended as a target.

KNOW YOUR TARGET AND WHAT IS BEYOND IT

Whether you are at the range or in the woods, if you're going to shoot, you must know what lies beyond your target. In almost all cases, you must be sure that there is something that will serve as a backstop to capture projectiles that miss or go through the target.

A GUN OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITY

As the owner of a firearm you have the responsibility and obligation of ensuring that any and all shooting activities are safe for everyone. This requires your personal commitment to carefully read, fully understand, and exercise the principles of proper firearm safety at all times. If this is the first handgun you have ever owned, or if you have limited experience with firearms, please visit your local shooting range and ask a trained professional to provide you with hands on training and tutorial. Doing this will improve your confidence and safety when using your firearm.

DISCLAIMER

The firearm to which these safety rules apply is sold under the express resulting condition that the manufacturer accepts no liability in part or whole for bodily injury, death, or property damage from:

- Improperly or carelessly handling the firearm.
- Using defective , improper caliber,
- hand-loaded, or reloaded ammunition.
- Inadequate maintenance of the handgun resulting in corrosion or damage.
- Negligence.
- Resale in contradiction of any applicable laws or regulations.
- Altering or converting the firearm's original aesthetic, functioning mechanisms, accessories, or mechanical configuration.
- Discharging with criminal intent or negligence.
- Failure to understand, adhere to, and follow the rules of firearm safety when using or handling the firearm.
- Or any other circumstances outside the manufacturer's direct or immediate control.

ALWAYS STORE YOUR FIREARM IN A SECURE STORAGE AREA TO PREVENT UNAUTHORIZED ACCESS

GForce Arms, Inc. recommends storing your firearm in a safe made specifically for firearms. Metal gun safes are recommended over open racks or glass front cabinets. In the case that a safe is not available for use, there are aftermarket trigger locking devices that can also be used to ensure that the firearm is unusable before storing in a conspicuous location such as a closet shelf, or other location out of plain view that is high enough to be out of the reach of young children. GForce Arms, Inc. also recommends that ammunition is stored in a separate location from the firearm. Never store a firearm loaded or with ammunition in the magazine.

NEVER:

- Leave a loaded gun unattended, propped up against a surface, or out of your hands.
- Assume a firearm is unloaded, even if you used it last. Always check to make sure that there is no ammunition and the chamber is clear.
- Load a cartridge into the chamber until you are ready to fire.
- Carry or transport your firearm with live ammunition in the chamber.
- Pass a firearm to another person or accept a firearm from another person, until the cylinder or slide is open and you have personally checked that the firearm is completely unloaded.
- Haul a loaded firearm openly or in a carrying case.
- Never transfer or hand a loaded firearm to someone else.

ALWAYS KEEP YOUR FINGER OFF THE TRIGGER UNTIL YOU ARE READY TO SHOOT

When holding the firearm be sure to rest your finger on the trigger guard or along the side of the gun.

NEVER:

- Touch the trigger until you are ready to fire.
- Engage in horseplay while handling a firearm.
- Rely on the safety devices of the gun. Mechanical safeties are never foolproof and can wear out and malfunction.

ALWAYS KEEP THE GUN POINTED IN A SAFE DIRECTION

A safe direction is one in which an accidental discharge cannot or would not cause injury or harm to yourself or others. Use extreme caution especially when loading and unloading your firearm. When handling any firearm always treat it as if it was loaded and ready to fire, even if you think it is empty. The recommended carrying position of your handgun is with the hammer in de-cocked position.

NEVER:

• Point your firearm at anything you don't intend to shoot.

• Use a firearm under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or any other substances that may impair your judgment, skills, or physical abilities.

• Target shoot or hunt with a firearm when you are fatigued or too tired to operate the firearm safely.

AMMUNITION

RECOMMENDED AMMUNITION

It is imperative to understand that the EXODUS should only be used with modern 9mm Luger ammunition cartridges. For optimal performance, we recommend using ONLY brass cased rounds. Aluminum or steel casings are not recommended.

IMPORTANT WARNING - AMMUNITION

Death, serious injury, and damage can result from the wrong ammunition, bore obstructions, powder overloads or incorrect cartridge components. Even the strongest gun can be blown up by excess pressure. Only use correct ammunition loaded to U.S. Industry Standards. Always wear shooting glasses and hearing protection. WARNING: IMPROPER AMMUNITION DESTROYS GUNS.

IMPORTANT WARNING - LEAD EXPOSURE

Discharging firearms in poorly ventilated areas, cleaning firearms, or handling ammunition may result in exposure to lead and other substances known to the State of California to cause birth defects, reproductive harm and other serious physical injury. Have adequate ventilation at all times. Wash hands thoroughly after exposure. WARNING: SHOOTING OR CLEANING GUNS MAY EXPOSE YOU TO LEAD.

AMMUNITION (CARTRIDGES) NOTICE

We specifically disclaim responsibility for any damage or injury whatsoever occurring in connection with, or as a result of, the use of faulty, sub-standard, remanufactured, or hand loaded (reloaded) ammunition, or of cartridges other than those for which the firearm was originally chambered.

SAFETY OPERATION

IMPORTANT WARNING - YOUR GFRPX9 EXODUS PISTOL DOES NOT HAVE A CONVENTIONAL MANUAL SAFETY AND WILL FIRE IF THE TRIGGER IS PULLED WHEN THERE IS A ROUND IN THE CHAMBER.

It is imperative as the owner of this firearm that you clearly understand where the safety mechanism is located on the firearm and how the safety mechanism works. The firearm uses a trigger face safety, where the trigger cannot be pulled unless proper finger placement on the trigger is achieved.



LOADING THE MAGAZINE

The magazine is loaded from the top by depressing the spring-loaded follower with the back end of the cartridge and then sliding the cartridge under the retention lips to the rear of the magazine. Continue this process to maximize the use of the magazine capacity.

LOADING THE FIREARM

First make sure that the firearm is pointed in a safe direction, in case for any reason the gun would accidentally discharge. Slide the top end of the loaded magazine firmly into the magazine well until the magazine catch secures and locks the magazine in place. Gripping the slide firmly, pull it to the rear position and then release the chamber a round. ONLY do this when you are ready to shoot the firearm.

WARNING - The pistol is now loaded and ready to fire.





FIRING PIN SAFETY TEST

NOTICE - THE FIRING PIN IS HELD IN THE FORWARD POSITION UNDER SPRING PRESSURE. DO NOT ALLOW THE FIRING PIN TO SNAP FORWARD AGAINST THE FIRING PIN SAFETY BECAUSE THIS COULD CAUSE DAMAGE TO THE FIRING PIN AND/OR THE FIRING PIN SAFETY.

- 1. Hold the slide and pull the lug of the firing pin, all the way to the rear of the slide and then ease it forward until it stops in contact with the firing pin safety.
- 2. Press the lug of the firing pin forward with your forefinger using moderate force. The firing pin must not move forward past the firing pin safety, and must not protrude from the breech face of the slide.

IMPORTANT WARNING - IF THE FIRING PIN SAFETY FAILS TO KEEP THE FIRING PIN FROM MOVING FORWARD, DO NOT LOAD OR FIRE YOUR GFRPX9 EXODUS PISTOL. INSTEAD, HAVE IT INSPECTED AND REPAIRED BY GFORCE ARMS SERVICE DEPT. OR A CERTIFIED GUNSMITH.

UNLOADING THE FIREARM

Ensure that the firearm is pointed in a safe direction. Keep your finger off of the trigger. Firmly push in the magazine release button until the magazine is released from the magazine well. Once the magazine has been released, pull the slide to the rear to eject any round that may be in the chamber. The cartridge will be ejected from the ejection port. Visually check the chamber to ensure that it is empty and unloaded. Perform a safety check by physically inserting your finger into the chamber to feel for the presence of a round or cartridge case in the chamber.



SHOOTING THE FIREARM

WARNING - USE SAFETY GLASSES AND HEARING PROTECTION WHEN SHOOTING

Wear safety glasses when firing the firearm to protect your eyes from airborne debris or projectile ricochet. When shooting, handguns will often produce decibels of 155 and higher. Exposure to sounds producing decibels over 70 can lead to hearing loss. Therefore, it is important to wear hearing protection when shooting.

WARNING - ALWAYS MAKE SURE THAT THE BARREL IS CLEAR OF ANY OBSTRUCTIONS BEFORE SHOOTING

Before loading always perform a safety check to make sure that there is no ammunition in the chamber or magazine. Examine the barrel for any obstructions or debris such as excess lubricant, dirt, or grease. If the bore is obstructed it can cause increased pressure causing the barrel to bulge or burst during use. Always use a cleaning rod and patch to remove any residues or obstructions in the barrel.

DO NOT TOUCH THE TRIGGER UNTIL YOU ARE ACTUALLY READY TO FIRE THE FIREARM

WARNING - FIRING

When firing the firearm, be sure that bystanders are well clear of the shooter and standing a safe distance behind the shooter. Empty cartridge cases are hot and are normally ejected from the handgun to the right of the shooter. They could cause injury to another person who is standing too closely alongside the shooter.

WARNING - THUMB POSITION

When holding the handgun, it is crucial to establish a firm and secure grip with both hands. The dominant hand should grasp the grip firmly, ensuring that the web between the thumb and index finger is high on the backstrap. The non-dominant hand should wrap around the fingers of the dominant hand, forming a solid support. During this process, it is important to pay close attention to the position of the shooters non dominant hand thumb. To prevent any interference or accidental injury to the shooter, the shooter's non-dominant thumb should NOT be placed BEHIND the handgun near the rear of the slide. The slide moves rearward at a very fast speed and can cause injury to any part of the hand if improperly positioned.

Step-by-step instructions to disassembly and reassemble the GForce Arms GFRPX9 EXODUS. if you prefer to follow along with a video, please visit our youtube channel and watch along. Search for GForce Arms GFRPX9 EXODUS Teardown on YouTube.

STEP 1: POINT THE PISTOL IN A SAFE DIRECTION (A SAFE DIRECTION IS ONE IN WHICH NO ONE CAN POSSIBLY BE INJURED IN THE EVENT OF AN UNINTENTIONAL DISCHARGE). KEEP YOUR FINGER OFF OF THE TRIGGER AND OUT OF THE TRIGGER GUARD. PRESS ON THE MAGAZINE CATCH AND REMOVE THE MAGAZINE.



STEP 2: WITH YOUR FINGER OFF OF THE TRIGGER AND OUT OF THE TRIGGER GUARD, LOCK THE SLIDE OPEN BY PUSHING UP ON THE SLIDE STOP LEVER WHILE PULLING THE SLIDE TO THE REAR WITH YOUR OTHER HAND. ONCE THE SLIDE IS LOCKED TO THE REAR, BOTH VISUALLY AND PHYSICALLY (WITH YOUR LITTLE FINGER) INSPECT BOTH THE CHAMBER AND THE MAGAZINE WELL OF THE PISTOL TO BE SURE THAT NO AMMUNITION REMAINS IN EITHER PLACE.



STEP 3: PULL BACK SLIDE TO RELEASE SLIDE STOP LEVER AND CLOSE SLIDE. POINT THE PISTOL IN A SAFE DIRECTION, THEN PULL THE TRIGGER. YOU WILL HEAR THE FIRING PIN MOVE FORWARD. HOLD THE PISTOL IN EITHER HAND SO THAT FOUR FINGERS GRASP THE TOP OF THE SLIDE. WITH THESE FOUR FINGERS, PULL AND HOLD THE SLIDE BACK APPROXIMATELY 1/10 INCH.

NOTE: If you pull the slide too far to the rear, it will reset the pistol's trigger to the forward position. If so, repeat the steps of unloading the pistol, point the pistol in a SAFE DIRECTION, pull the trigger to the rearward position, and begin steps of slide removal again.



STEP 4: SIMULTANEOUSLY, PULL DOWN AND HOLD BOTH SIDES OF THE SLIDE LOCK USING THE THUMB AND INDEX FINGER OF YOUR FREE HAND. PUSH THE SLIDE FORWARD UNTIL IT IS FULLY SEPARATED FROM THE RECEIVER. PUSH THE RECOIL SPRING ASSEMBLY SLIGHTLY FORWARD WHILE LIFTING IT AWAY FROM THE BARREL.

Safety Caution: The recoil spring assembly is under tension and can spring loose causing eye or other injury. During removal use care to control the recoil spring assembly.



STEP 5: REMOVE THE RECOIL SPRING ASSEMBLY, AND LIFT THE BARREL FROM THE SLIDE.

Safety Caution: Further disassembly by the user is neither required nor recommended, and should only be performed by a GForce Arms Safety Technician or certified-Gunsmith.



REASSEMBLY PROCEDURES RE-ASSEMBLE THE FIREARM BY REVERSING THE DISASSEMBLY STEPS ABOVE

Clean all parts of the slide, barrel, and guide rod/spring with solvent and oil made for firearms. For cleaning, there is no need to break down the frame and trigger parts. Wipe off all parts of the slide and trigger that are exposed with a soft cloth. To assemble the slide, perform steps 2-4 in reverse order. Once the barrel and guide rod/spring are installed in the slide, attach the slide to the frame by lining up the grooves in the rear of the slide with the front tabs on the frame. Push the slide to the rear until it engages with the frame. Function test the fully assembled firearm by ensuring the slide pulls to the rear and release without issue.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

It is essential that regular maintenance and cleaning be performed to maintain the accuracy, function, and maximize the longevity of your firearm. Before cleaning ALWAYS perform a safety check to make sure that the firearm is unloaded prior to cleaning. Your firearm should be free from rust, dirt, grease and firing residues in order to function reliably. The critical components that should be kept clean and oiled regularly include the following:

- Slide
- Barrel
- Slide Spring and Rod
- Frame
- Trigger Assembly

Failure to maintain these key components could result in damage to the firearm, failure to function, and could result in a major safety hazard.


SERIAL NUMBER OF THE FIREARM
