You should fully understand the function of all of the components and mechanics of the firearm. Before you remove the firearm out of the box thoroughly read the owner's manual on how to properly carry, handle, load, unload, and store your new firearm. Know the rules of proper gun safety and exercise them at all times because failure to do so may result in death or injury to yourself or others. Because it is impossible to list every firearm situation or scenario, be aware that certain circumstances may require additional safety rules unique to a particular situation. In these cases, we recommend that you obtain specific training by a certified instructor for unique situations

ALWAYS LEARN THE SPECIFIC MECHANICAL AND HANDLING CHARACTERISTICS OF YOUR FIREARM

All firearms are different thus it is important for you to understand how to properly carry, use, and handle each one according to its specific guidelines. Before using any firearm, one must completely familiarize themselves with the type of firearm and its specific safe handling procedures for loading, unloading and carrying.

NEVER GIVE THE FIREARM TO ANY PERSON WHO HAS NOT THOROUGHLY FAMILIARIZED HIMSELF OR HERSELF WITH ALL OF THE INFORMATION,

SAFETY RULES, AND WARNINGS IN THE OWNER'S MANUAL

NEVER ALTER OR MODIFY YOUR FIREARM

This firearm was produced under specific manufacturer guidelines and should not be modified under ANY circumstances. Altering the trigger, mechanical components, safety mechanisms, or using any parts or accessories other than those that were provided in the original box with your gun or specifically recommended in this manual is NOT RECOMMENDED by the manufacturer, and could result death, bodily harm, or compromise your safety or the safety of others. Any alteration made to the firearm also voids the factory warranty.

ALWAYS KEEP THE FIREARM UNLOADED UNTIL READY TO USE

Firearms should be kept unloaded when not in use. Whenever you pick up a firearm, immediately engage the safety device and remove the magazine to visually inspect the chamber and confirm that it is clear. Always unload all ammunition from the chamber and remove the magazine after:

- 1.) Shooting
- 2.) Putting the firearm away
- 3.) Putting the firearm into a case
- 4.) When not in use
- 5.) When handing it to another person

ALWAYS KEEP THE MUZZLE POINTED IN A SAFE DIRECTION

It's as simple as that, and it's up to you. Never point your gun at anything you do not intend to shoot. The safe direction may be "up" on some occasions or "down" on others, but never pointed at anyone or anything not intended as a target.

KNOW YOUR TARGET AND WHAT IS BEYOND IT

Whether you are at the range or in the woods, if you're going to shoot, you must know what lies beyond your target. In almost all cases, you must be sure that there is something that will serve as a backstop to capture projectiles that miss or go through the target.

A GUN OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITY

As the owner of a firearm you have the responsibility and obligation of ensuring that any and all shooting activities are safe for everyone. This requires your personal commitment to carefully read, fully understand, and exercise the principles of proper firearm safety at all times. If this is the first firearm you have ever owned, or if you have limited experience with firearms, please visit your local shooting range and ask a trained professional to provide you with hands on training and tutorial. Doing this will improve your confidence and safety when using your firearm.

DISCLAIMER

The firearm to which these safety rules apply is sold under the express resulting condition that the manufacturer accepts no liability in part or whole for bodily injury, death, or property damage from:

- Improperly or carelessly handling the firearm.
- Using defective, improper caliber, hand-loaded, or reloaded ammunition.
- Inadequate maintenance of the firearm resulting in corrosion or damage.
- Negligence.
- Resale in contradiction of any applicable laws or regulations.
- Altering or converting the firearm's original aesthetic, functioning mechanisms, accessories, or mechanical configuration.
- Discharging with criminal intent or negligence.
- Failure to understand, adhere to, and follow the rules of firearm safety when using or handling the firearm.

ALWAYS STORE YOUR FIREARM IN A SECURE STORAGE AREA TO PREVENT UNAUTHORIZED ACCESS

GForce Arms, Inc. recommends storing your firearm in a safe made specifically for firearms. Metal gun safes are recommended over open racks or glass front cabinets. In the case that a safe is not available for use, there are aftermarket trigger locking devices that can also be used to ensure that the firearm is unusable before storing in a conspicuous location such as a closet shelf, or other location out of plain view that is high enough to be out of the reach of young children. GForce Arms, Inc. also recommends that ammunition is stored in a separate location from the firearm. Never store a firearm loaded or with ammunition in the magazine.

NEVER:

- Leave a loaded gun unattended, propped up against a surface, or out of your hands
- Assume a firearm is unloaded, even if you used it last. Always check to make sure that there is no ammunition and the chamber is clear.
- Load a cartridge into the chamber until you are ready to fire.
- Carry or transport your firearm with live ammunition in the chamber.
- Pass a firearm to another person or accept a firearm from another person, until the cylinder or slide is open and you have personally checked that the firearm is completely unloaded.
- Haul a loaded firearm openly or in a carrying case.
- Never transfer or hand a loaded firearm to someone else.

ALWAYS KEEP YOUR FINGER OFF THE TRIGGER UNTIL YOU ARE READY TO SHOOT

When holding the firearm be sure to rest your finger on the trigger guard or along the side of the gun.

NEVER:

- Touch the trigger until you are ready to fire.
- Engage in horseplay while handling a firearm.
- Rely on the safety devices of the gun. Mechanical safeties are never foolproof and can wear out and malfunction.

ALWAYS KEEP THE GUN POINTED IN A SAFE DIRECTION

A safe direction is one in which an accidental discharge cannot or would not cause injury or harm to yourself or others. Use extreme caution especially when loading and unloading your firearm. When handling any firearm always treat it as if it was loaded and ready to fire, even if you think it is empty. The recommended carrying position of your firearm is with the hammer in de-cocked position.

NEVER:

- Point your firearm at anything you don't intend to shoot.
- Use a firearm under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or any other substances that may impair your judgment, skills, or physical abilities.
- Target shoot or hunt with a firearm when you are fatigued or too tired to operate the firearm safely.

AMMUNITION

RECOMMENDED AMMUNITION

The JAWBONE is recommended to be used with high-quality, full power ammunition loaded to a MINIMUM of 1,100 FPS.* Use of ammo that is less than 1,100FPS will result in feeding issues, as it will not be able to reliably cycle the mass required for a blowback firearm.

*GForce Arms supports the use of silencers, and STRONGLY recommends using subsonic ammunition (loads less than 1,100FPS) when shooting suppressed to reduce backpressure and bolt velocity. To reiterate, silencer use is the ONLY application where GForce Arms suggests using subsonic ammunition, and will not be able to troubleshoot, or warranty, any problems resulting from using subsonic ammunition in an unsuppressed firearm.

Use of +P ammunition with a silencer may VOID the lifetime warranty of any GForce Arms product.

ALWAYS FUNCTION TEST ANY NEW AMMUNITION BEFORE USING IN COMPETITION, FOR PERSONAL DEFENSE, OR BUYING IN BULK FOR LEISURE SHOOTING.

ALWAYS USE AMMUNITION THAT COMPLIES WITH THE INDUSTRY PERFORMANCE STANDARDS ESTABLISHED BY THE SPORTING ARMS AND AMMUNITION MANUFACTURERS' INSTITUTE, INC. OF THE UNITED STATES (SAAMI) OR AMMUNITION MANUFACTURED TO MILITARY SPECIFICATIONS.

NEVER USE CARTRIDGES THAT ARE DIRTY, WET, CORRODED, BENT OR DAMAGED.

NEVER OIL CARTRIDGES.

NEVER SPRAY AEROSOL-TYPE LUBRICANTS, PRESERVATIVE, OR CLEANERS DIRECTLY ONTO CARTRIDGES OF WHERE EXCESS SPRAY MAY FLOW INTO CONTACT WITH CARTRIDGES.

Reloading is a science and improperly loaded ammunition can be extremely dangerous. GForce Arms specifically disclaims responsibility for any damage or injury whatsoever occurring in connection with, or as a result of, the use of faulty nonstandard, "re-manufactured" hand-loaded (reloaded) ammunition, or cartridges other than those for which the firearm was originally chambered.

GForce Arms does NOT recommend ammunition of the following types: **

- Aluminum cased ammunition (Blazer Aluminum)
- Syntech PCC ammunition
- Frangible ammunition

For function testing and leisure shooting we recommend:

- Winchester 115gr FMI Brass Case 9mm
- Fiocchi 115gr Training Dynamics Bass Case 9mm

For personal defense applications we recommend:

- Federal Premium LE 124gr HST HP

IMPORTANT WARNING - LEAD EXPOSURE

Discharging firearms in poorly ventilated areas, cleaning firearms, or handling ammunition may result in exposure to lead and other substances known to the State of California to cause birth defects, reproductive harm and other serious physical injury. MAGAZINE SELECTION

Use high-quality magazines like genuine Glock, Magpul, KCI or Amend2.

GForce Arms does NOT recommend, and will not be able to troubleshoot, or warranty, any problems resulting from the following:

- Non-factory capacity magazines (i.e. drum magazines, 100rd. magazines, etc.)
- Homemade or aftermarket magazines extensions, couplers, or other "competition" widgets.
- Magazines made from clear plastic.

Magazines are wear items that need to be replaced over time.

- Number your magazines for troubleshooting to determine if a particular magazine is a consistent source of problems.
- Older magazine may benefit from replacing the magazine spring for reliable operation.
- Compare angle and height of the top round in old magazines to new magazines to see if the feed lips have worn out.

GForce Arms will ALWAYS warranty issues when high quality Glock, Magpul, KCl or Amend2 factory magazines are used.

***Magazines made from clear plastic lack the feed lip durability of traditional glass filled polymers. The clear plastic also lacks the slickness of glass filled polymers which can produce feeding issues.





SAFETY OPERATION

Always use the manual safety. The manual safety should be all the way in the safe position, not half way or at some other point in its travel. The manual safety should remain in the safe position until ready to fire. The trigger guard is a physical obstruction that helps prevent unintended pressing of the trigger or trigger safety. Do not modify the trigger guard.

THE SAFETY LEVER CAN BE ROTATED COUNTER-CLOCKWISE TO THE SAFE POSITION WHEN THE HAMMER IS IN THE REARMOST FULLY COCKED POSITION OR IS IN THE HALF-COCKED POSITION. HALF-COCKED IS A POSITION BETWEEN THE REST AND THE FULLY COCKED POSITIONS. TO REACH THE HALF-COCKED POSITION SLOWLY PULL THE HAMMER FROM ITS REST POSITION TILL YOU HEAR THE CHARACTERISTIC SOUND OF A COUPLING.









LOADING THE FIREARM

The magazine is loaded from the top by depressing the spring-loaded follower with the back end of the cartridge and then sliding the cartridge under the retention lips to the rear of the magazine. Continue this process to maximize the use of the magazine capacity.

First make sure that the firearm is pointed in a safe direction, in case for any reason the gun would accidentally discharge. Slide the top end of the loaded magazine firmly into the magazine well until the magazine catch secures and locks the magazine in place. Gripping the slide firmly, pull it to the rear position and then release the chamber a round. ONLY do this when you are ready to shoot the firearm.

WARNING - The pistol is now loaded and ready to fire.









WARNING! LOADED PISTOL

If dropped or struck with the safety off, the firearm may fire. Such a discharge can occur without the trigger being directly struck or touched. Never rest a loaded pistol against any object (wall, fence, vehicle, tree, etc.) because there is always the possibility that the firearm will be jarred or slide from its position and fall with sufficient force to discharge. Keep safety on unless actually firing.

ANY GUN MAY FIRE IF DROPPED.

INSTALL SECONDARY MAGAZINE

Slide the spare magazine up into the grip until the magazine catch clicks and locks the magazine in place. To remove, push the magazine catch button on the grip to release the spare magazine and pull the magazine free from the grip.



HOW TO ADJUST THE BRACE

The brace can be repositioned forward or backward by pushing the spring-loaded brace lever to unlock the brace from it's current position. Then push or pull the brace on the buffer tube to the desired position location. Release the lever when the brace is positioned at the desired location to allow it to relock into its new position.



UNLOADING THE FIREARM

Ensure that the firearm is pointed in a safe direction. Keep your finger off of the trigger. Firmly push in the magazine release button until the magazine is released from the magazine well. Once the magazine has been released, pull the slide to the rear to eject any round that may be in the chamber. The cartridge will be ejected from the ejection port. Visually check the chamber to ensure that it is empty and unloaded. Perform a safety check by physically inserting your finger into the chamber to feel for the presence of a round or cartridge case in the chamber.



SHOOTING THE FIREARM

WARNING - USE SAFETY GLASSES AND HEARING PROTECTION WHEN SHOOTING

Wear safety glasses when firing the firearm to protect your eyes from airborne debris or projectile ricochet. When shooting, firearms will often produce decibels of 155 and higher. Exposure to sounds producing decibels over 70 can lead to hearing loss. Therefore, it is important to wear hearing protection when shooting.

WARNING - ALWAYS MAKE SURE THAT THE BARREL IS CLEAR OF ANY OBSTRUCTIONS BEFORE SHOOTING

Before loading always perform a safety check to make sure that there is no ammunition in the chamber or magazine. Examine the barrel for any obstructions or debris such as excess lubricant, dirt, or grease. If the bore is obstructed it can cause increased pressure causing the barrel to bulge or burst during use. Always use a cleaning rod and patch to remove any residues or obstructions in the barrel.

DO NOT TOUCH THE TRIGGER UNTIL YOU ARE ACTUALLY READY TO FIRE THE FIREARM

WARNING - FIRING

When firing the firearm, be sure that bystanders are well clear of the shooter and standing a safe distance behind the shooter. Empty cartridge cases are hot and are normally ejected from the firearm to the right of the shooter. They could cause injury to another person who is standing too closely alongside the shooter.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

It is essential that regular maintenance and cleaning be performed to maintain the accuracy, function, and maximize the longevity of your firearm. Before cleaning ALWAYS perform a safety check to make sure that the firearm is unloaded prior to cleaning. Your firearm should be free from rust, dirt, grease and firing residues in order to function reliably.

The critical components that should be kept clean and oiled regularly include the following:

- Barrel
- Bolt Assembly
- Trigger and Hammer mechanisms
- Safety
- Bolt catch

Failure to maintain these key components could result in damage to the firearm, failure to function, and could result in a major safety hazard.

It is recommended that you record your serial number in your manual and keep the information in a secured location. Always keep the serial number visible and unobstructed from view.

WARRANTY INFORMATION



AMBIDEXTROUS BOLT CATCH ROD


Use of ambidextrous bolt catch rod requires a clearance cut on the upper receiver.



Refer to the Page 12 for the correct size and location of the needed clearance cut.



LOWER EXPLODED VIEW




